EMPOWERING COMMUNITIES
Enhancing human security and the capacity of Iraqi civil society and communities to address their own needs.



EPIC was founded in 1998 by veterans of the 1991 Gulf War who believe that a human security approach can make Iraq safe and prosperous again. EPIC brought together veterans, aid workers, doctors, faith communities, and concerned Americans and Iraqis as a grassroots movement. EPIC became a leading voice in the United States, amplifying the concerns of Iraqis and leading the conversation in Washington, DC on the impact of economic sanctions and human rights violations.

Today, EPIC works directly with civil society leaders and communities in Iraq to provide relief to vulnerable populations, monitor the crisis to better inform public policy, and enhance understanding of Iraq's story. EPIC is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization registered in the District of Columbia. EPIC envisions a safe and prosperous Iraq in which all citizens live free from want and fear, and with dignity.

SAFE RETURN
As part of a multi-organization USAID project, EPIC is providing support for the safe and voluntary return of internally displaced Iraqis — many from minority communities — to their homes in the Ninewa Plains and Western Ninewa. EPIC is conducting surveys on issues related to perceived safety and community trust, training monitors and reporters to map conditions and vulnerabilities, and developing messaging campaigns that will encourage community buy-in to support minority returns.

CONNECTION INITIATIVE
EPIC links Iraqi civil society organizations with skilled Iraqi-Americans living in the United States to share their resources. Iraq's multi-generational diaspora represents a vast yet largely untapped reservoir of talent that we mobilize to build civil society capacity at a critical moment in Iraq's political and social development.
